It was all the rage. Perhaps by the time you are reading this, nobody is talking about it anymore. I'm talking about the ice bucket challenge. It was all over television and all over Facebook: people having buckets of ice water dumped on them in the hope of

raising awareness for Lou Gehrig's Disease. Is there anybody who didn't take the ALS ice bucket challenge? Nobody, except for me, maybe? Many people, my husband and son included, did the challenge more than once. I couldn't bring myself to do it at all.

The ice bucket challenge really bothered me. It took me a long time to figure out why. My husband suggested maybe what was bothering me was the backward-ness of the idea: by pouring ice water over one's self, one didn't have to contribute to the charity. But according to Time Magazine, nearly 2 million people have contributed nearly 80 million dollars to ALS in the name of the ice bucket challenge, so it can't be that.

Some clergy friends don't like the amount of water that's being wasted considering the rate at which children die from not having access to clean water. I read a blog that suggested the challenge is frivolous in light of the magnitude of suffering of people around the world. Those are both interesting points, but I can't honestly say those are my issues either.

Then it occurred to me. I'm jealous.

I'm jealous. Not at the amount of money raised, but by the passion that people are putting into this challenge.

I'm jealous because God wants our passion. God wants our heart, soul and mind. God wants us to be passionate for him. God wants us to be passionate for all of the people living in the world who are far from God.

I want the people in our congregation to be more excited about God than they were about the ice bucket challenge. I want you to challenge each other to pray and read your Bibles every day. I want you to challenge each other to come to worship every week, to join a small group, to be involved in mission. I want you to challenge each other to invite your friends to come to church with you. And then I want you to challenge each other to make new friends who are far from God, so that, when the time is right, you can introduce them to Jesus. I want you to know God in such a depth in your being that you are highly passionate about him.

Okay, I really don't want to be a wet blanket. Enjoy the ice bucket challenge. Hopefully a cure, or at least a treatment for ALS, will be found because of it.

But I'm not going to challenge you to dump a bucket of ice water over your head. I challenge you to challenge one another to deeper faith.

I'll see you in church, where we encourage one another to be passionate for Jesus. $\mathcal{A}_{\mathcal{M}}^{\mathcal{C}}$

On June 30 Pastor Brenda asked the congregation to write the difference their faith makes in their lives in 100 words or less. You can listen to that sermon on the church website. Here are 2 examples of how Jesus has made a difference in the lives of people of our church:

My family regularly attended a small, local rural church supported by five families. Most of the time, we just had Sunday School, but occasionally a retired pastor would preach for a week-long revival, concluded by an altar call.

At age 15, I attended a Youth for Christ meeting, and early the next morning, felt my heart "strangely warmed" as did John Wesley. Thereafter, I gave testimony in church, read the Bible daily, though unsystematically. At age 19, I was baptized in the Rushville Methodist Church. Bible reading slumped during my army and graduate school, but the eight Volunteers-in-Missions work camps enlivened my spirit, and a heart attack plus the death of my wife deepened my reliance on God and the church.

In the last 8 years, I have: visited approximately 9 shut-in, concluding with prayer, written four religious tracts, daily devotions from Upper Room, intercessory prayers fro the afflicted, family, the country, special needs, and reread the entire Bible over the last 15 months. \sim Roy Shaver

I can say with complete honesty that without my faith I would not still be present on this earth. My faith is what sustains me through all the troubles and challenges that life has presented me. I clearly know that God is walking with me every stet of the way. When I forget and decide to go it on my own, God has a way of nudging me (sometimes a little harder than a nudge) to remind me that I am not walking through this life alone.
