A few days ago several people from our church went on our first prayer walk. We hopped into the church van and drove down to the neighborhoods that were hit by the tornado. As we walked by each house we prayed silently for the people who lived there. We

prayed for their strength and for their peace. We prayed for healing from their loss. We prayed for their fears and for their hopes. We said hello to a few people, but we mostly just quietly prayed. As we slowly walked from house to house, I felt myself becoming different. I felt filled with compassion and love.

Prayer is a strange thing. It impacts us as it impacts God. We often think of prayer as making requests of God, but God also uses our prayer life to transform us. The goal of the Christian life is to become more like Christ. God uses our prayer time for this transformation.

In Paul's letter to the church at Rome, Paul wrote, "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." That is incredible compassion! Praying for others grows our heart of compassion for others.

As summer continues, and you are spending time outside with neighbors, family and friends, in your yard, at the pool or beach, camping, or at ball games, notice those around you. Say brief little prayers for those you know and those you don't know. Say hello. Show little acts of kindness. As you continue seeing some of the same people, continue praying for them. Continue growing in relationship with them. So many people in our town are hurting and need the love that Christ would flow through you. Perhaps at some time the Holy Spirit will nudge you to share your faith with that person.* The more you pray for people, the more compassion God will give you for people, and the more you will share the love of Christ by just being you.

We will soon be scheduling a prayer walk in the neighborhoods by our church. You are welcome to join us, so be sure to watch the announcements. And be sure to be doing your own praying for people that you see when you are out and about.

I'll see you in church where we expect that God will transform our hearts to become like his.



The content will be different, so be sure to attend both events if you are able.




And the mystery guest was....

PUMC Elevator Challenge

The elevator task force would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the elevator project. The elevator budget is \$80,000 and we are getting closer to what is needed to start construction. Currently, the amount received in donations for the elevator exceeds \$37,000 and over \$14,000 more has been pledged but not received. All of the donations have been placed in a fund that is restricted for use in constructing an elevator.

The Platteville United Methodist Church provides space for many functions and groups outside of worship service and church related functions in Fellowship Hall. This service to the community was highlighted in a proposal to the Platteville Community Fund for \$5,000 for the elevator. Unfortunately, the proposal was not selected for funding. However, the PUMC service to the community impressed another individual who saw the proposal and has offered to match the next \$5,000 that is raised for the elevator. If we raise an additional \$5,000 we can receive \$5,000 from the benefactor. In effect, every dollar of the next \$5,000 donated will be doubled. If we are able to meet the challenge of raising \$5,000 more, we can get the \$5,000 match and our total will be closer to the total needed to proceed. Please help us meet this challenge by donating to the elevator fund and help us achieve our goal. Any contributions that are made for this challenge should be designated that they are for the challenge match.

The May 2014 issue is dedicated entirely to the topic, The Church and People with Disabilities, one of the studies for the UMW in 20115, and one of the three studies at Mission u, July 28-31 and the one day experience on Aug.1st.

Here are some statistics from the magazine:

There are 303,858 Persons living with disabilities in the US. Of this, 241,682 are 15 or older.

21.3%-People 15 and over who live with disability

14.6%-People 15 and over with a sight disability

3.1%-People 15 and over with a reading disability

1.2%=People 15 and over with a speech disability

12.6%People 15 and over who have difficulty walking

6.3%-People 15 and over with a mental or emotional disability

41.1%-People 15 and over with a disability who are employed.

Every child who is baptized at Platteville UMC receives a baptism blanket crocheted by one of our church members. Recently Eli Vrielinck was baptized, and was excited to snuggle with his new blanket!



You can purchase gift cards for America's most popular retailers through Scrip and use them for everyday purchases. Scrip gift cards are the same as gift cards you can purchase from the retailer. With over 300 of the country's biggest brands, including grocery and department stores, gas stations, restaurants, hotels and home improvement, Scrip has something to appeal to every family.

Families pay face value for their gift cards and PUMC orders them at a discount from Great Lakes Scrip Center. The church receives an instant rebate and families do not have to purchase anything they don't need.

Jennifer's Example: At my mom's church they sell Scrip. She gets a \$100 Kwik Trip card each month. She is able to use the card to purchase gas, milk, bread, etc at Kwik Trip. The church receives a 9% rebate on every card she purchases for Kwik Trip. So, at the end of the year she has purchased 12, \$100 cards, and the church has received \$108 just from that one family. If 10 families did the same thing, that would be over \$1000/year for the church.

Jennifer will order scrip on Tuesdays. All orders can be turned in with a check made out to PUMC, include "Scrip" in the notes area. Cards usually arrive 2 days after they are ordered. Orders can be picked up in the office or on Sunday mornings.

A group of people from Platteville, including some from our congregation have been studying ways to help the homeless and have decided to start a Family Promise chapter in Grant County. They hope that our church will sign on as a host church. As a host church we would offer a week of overnight hospitality for up to five families or fourteen people total, four times a year. We would provide dinner, semi-private places to sleep, two hosts that would sleep overnight at the church, breakfast, and a sack lunch. The families would not be at the church during the day. We are in need of a task group to explore how this would fit in our congregation and how we would do this logistically. We have four people interested in the task group already. Would you like to join them? Church Council chairperson Don Shaw said, "I don't see how we can not do this," as he volunteered to be part of the exploration task group. There will be an eight minute video shown during worship on July 12 to introduce our congregation to Family Promise. A task group will gather to figure out logistics, and then it will be brought to the congregation for questions and input before a vote will be taken by the church council.
