It was a very big deal. In Matthew 25, Jesus said that whenever we do anything for somebody who can't do it for themselves, we do it for him. That day Amanda and her parents moved a dresser for Jesus.

Annie Dillard once wrote, "How we spend our days is, of course, how we spend our lives." It is true. So many of us are so caught up in the busyness of our lives that we spend very little time each day doing things for people who cannot do things for themselves. We end up with another year going by with us having good intentions.

What are you doing for Jesus? How are you helping those who need it? What random act of kindness have you shown? How have you blessed somebody?

.Jesus said, "People will know you are my disciples by how you love each other." Jesus was talking about how disciples love other disciples, but Jesus also wants our love to reach out to others.

As you did anything for somebody who needed it, you did it for Jesus. Go do something for Jesus today. And tomorrow. And the next day. Make doing things for people such a regular part of your life, that when somebody brings it to your attention, you think it's no big deal.

I'll see you in church, where we fill up on love, so we can go share that love with others!

We had a hugely successful Sunday School program in 2013-14! More than 70 children and youth have participated in our Sunday School classes and activities this year. We learned the stories of Samuel and David, the Nativity, the teachings of Jesus, Holy Week and Easter stories, and about the leaders of the early church.

Our mission project for the year was to support Grant County Habitat for Humanity.

Students brought in their quarters and dollar offerings each week, sponsored bakes sales

each month, and decorated and sold wooden houses at Christmas to financially support the house building. On the weekends that our church members worked on the house, some of our youth helped prepare and serve the workers lunch. Our young people have raised \$5815.00 this year for Grant County Habitat for Humanity. 90% of that money will go to the Grant County project, and 10% will be used to build houses in Malawi, Africa.

Regional Shared Ministry News

On Sunday May 18, it was announced that the Cabinet* has formally approved the Platte River Regional Shared Ministry and has appointed Rev. Brenda K. Whitford and Rev. Elizabeth M. Whitford to it. The appointments are effective July 1, 2014. It is typical for Regional Shared Ministry to begin immediately after being approved, so the Platteville SPRC has asked Rev Elizabeth Whitford to begin immediately.



The SPRC would like to welcome Rev Elizabeth M. Whitford as our new Associate Pastor. Many of us here at PUMC are familiar with Pastor Liz, as she has attended 8:30 worship since her mother was appointed here. She entered the path to ordained ministry through our church, so it is especially exciting that she will be serving here. Pastor Liz will continue to preach each Sunday at the Whig UMC and provide their pastoral leadership and their pastoral care. She will be overseeing the areas that we have identified that we would like to be part of our Regional Shared Ministry. Pastor Liz will continue to lead Vacation Bible School, and will also oversee the areas of youth and campus ministries. During the summers she will be working considerably more. She will begin seminary in the fall, and will work half time between the two churches during the school year.

People are asking questions about Regional Shared Ministry

What is the Platt River Regional Shared Ministry? This is the formal name, required by the Book of Discipline, for the Platteville UMC and the Whig UMC to work together in specified areas. It allows us to have autonomy as churches and yet meet our needs for clergy in a new and creative way. It allows us to work together to make a greater difference for the Kingdom of God.

We used to have a lay staff person doing youth and campus ministry. Why do we want a pastor to do it now? Lay staff are generally hired to do ministry. Clergy are appointed to oversee ministry. Pastor Liz will begin by doing the ministry, as we currently have no volunteer leaders. Hopefully within the first year she will be able to raise some leadership and she will begin overseeing ministry done by the people of our church.

How can we afford to have two pastors again? When we discontinued our Youth, Campus Ministry and Small Group Coordinator position, we had a sum of money available. The SPRC decided to go in a different direction and is using those funds for our second pastor. No additional cost is being added to the budget.

What is going to be different? Only the areas in which the churches are working together will be affected. Vacation Bible School will continue exactly as it has been, since we've already been working together. Whig college students have been participating in the Passion Conference, so we will simply be doing more together. We will no longer each have our own youth group. The two church youth groups will be combined in order to reach more youth for the Kingdom of God.

*Clergy in the United Methodist Church are not hired, they are appointed by the Cabinet, which consists of the Bishop, the Assistant to the Bishop, and the four District Superintendents.
