We will not be transformed, nor will we know what we could have been if we had chosen to continue where God was leading us. Or, we can choose to push through, continuing to study and be trained in our faith, following Jesus to new levels in our faith, as he makes us new. The first choice will come with regret; the second choice will come with grace and joy. What will you chose?

I will leave you with this: Jesus loves you exactly where you are, but he loves you too much to let you stay there! That's because he knows what you can be, what your potential is, and as always he wants to draw you closer to him!

Question: I don't like some of the things that Francis Chan says in "Crazy Love." Do Pastor Brenda and Mindy really expect me to believe all this stuff?

Answer: Not necessarily. We do expect it to transform you! Let me explain: Francis Chan is highly conservative, theologically, and many United Methodists are not. So you are allowed to disagree with some of the things he says. But his premise is flawless: the fact that the God who created the universe loves us, is "crazy" – it's beyond our understanding. God wants for our response back - loving God and loving others - to be just as crazy.

Our United Methodist theology is an incredible blessing! We agree that we all believe the essentials (basically the Apostles' Creed), and then we are allowed to have an opinion on the rest. We are all allowed to consider scripture, tradition, reason, and experience (called the "quadrilateral") and create the nuances of our own theology through them. Theology is simply what you believe about God. Our United Methodist theology is rich especially because we come together to share our individual theologies, disagree, and grow because of our interaction with others. John Wesley, when he first started the Methodist movement, insisted that people meet together in small groups to hold one another accountable to growing in faith. As we read Crazy Love, you might disagree with some of the things Francis says and then be stretched by others. Talking about it in a small group helps us grow as we talk about the things that challenge us. You may decide, as with any Christian author, that there are some things you simply disagree with. But as Mindy said earlier in the newsletter, you must decide if you are going to continue living the way you always have, or if you will let God transform your life through Francis' writing and your discussion in your small group.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We are very excited to offer Summer Sunday School for the first time this year. This will be for a short term (5 Sundays in July), and all the lessons will be about the same book or story, so if a child misses one week, they can jump right in again the next Sunday. These classes will be during the regular Sunday School time of 9:45-10:45, on July 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29.

We are offering two classes for two different age groups.

3 year old - 1st grade: These would be all those children who were in Ellen, Debby and Amber's class last year. We will be studying the parable of The Sower and the Seed (Matthew 13), and using our Church garden out back to relate to the story of the seeds. Each week we will read a different version of the Bible story, do an art or science project, plant and weed in the garden, and have a "garden" snack. This class will be co-taught by Kelsie Simmons, Tracy Harle, Susan Schlager and Pam Smidt, and will meet in the upstairs classroom.

2nd - 5th grade: This class is for those who were in the 2nd-3rd class (Jan Langel and Sue Dykstra) and the 4th-5th class (George Krueger) this past year. This summer we are going to do a book discussion club on the classic C.S.Lewis novel The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. Many children know this story because of the movie, but it is a story that expresses some of the most profound truths of the Christian faith. This will give our youth a chance to see this fairy tale from a Christian perspective. The class will involve reading 4 chapters a week at home (children can read the book themselves or have a parent read aloud) and then discussing the chapters and doing activities during the class. Books will be available at the first class.

This is the first time we have offered a book club/discussion for kids, and we think it will be a great experience. The class will be co-taught by Jan Langel, Sara Koeller and Dianne Edgette, and will meet in the middle classroom downstairs. If you have a child in the Junior High class who would like to participate in the book club, they are very welcome to join the class.

Schedules are hectic during the summer, and you may not be home every weekend. Consider these as "drop-in" classes, that your child can attend the Sundays that you are home. Children may bring friends to these Sunday School classes with them, even if they are not church members. Hope to see you during July!
