I was chatting with a new stylist a few weeks ago, as she was cutting my hair, and she asked what I do. When I told her I was a pastor, she immediately changed the conversation to my children and what they are doing. She wondered aloud what someone with a music performance degree would do with it, so I told her that Elizabeth was going to go on to school to be a pastor also.

I can still see the look of bewilderment on her face. She stopped cutting, looked at me strangely in the mirror, and said, "Why would she want to do THAT?"

I began telling her about how Elizabeth wants to share God's love with people and help them to begin and grow in faith, and she dismissed my explanation. She went on to tell me about how her grandmother had dragged her to church when she was young. It was boring, she hated it, and she was never going to church again.

We spent the rest of my haircut with me asking her what she remembered that she didn't like, and then telling her how things are different at our church. I told her she might like church the way her grandmother likes it, now that she's an adult. I told her about our Contemporary Worship Service, and she was astonished that a church would have a contemporary band (I told her we have three!). We talked about community, faith, love and hope.

I invited her to come to worship, writing the times on the back of my business card.

As I left, I wondered: what will she find if she looks at our website? (*Ps – Gary Lindahl is currently redesigning our website. It is not up and running yet, but should be wonderful when it is ready!*) What if she actually comes to church? Will people greet her? Will she feel welcomed? Will we speak in church-eze (church language) or will she be able to understand? Will the music be excellent? Will my sermon speak to both her and someone who has been a person of faith their entire lives? Will the visit bring back the negative experiences of her childhood, or will she find a place to belong?

Of all of the times of the year, back-to-school time is the time more people consider going back to church than any other time of the year. People look to Christmas and Easter as special occasions, but back-to-school time is a time to begin attending a church regularly. If there is one time of the year that we need to make sure we are excellent for visitors, it is the fall. I would encourage each of us to increase our effort to be welcoming. Let's come to worship expecting to have an encounter with God, and longing to share that with those worshiping around us. I invite you to do whatever you can to make our worship excellent.

And when God sends "de-churched" people to us, they will say, "I love it here! I wish I had gone back to church a long time ago!"

I'll see you in church, where we love each other and love to bring new people to Jesus!
